Building on the Successes of 2017

ITWomen is a non-profit organization founded in 2002 by senior level women across technology industries. Through our partnerships with non-profits, universities, corporate sponsors and professional organizations, we strive to narrow the gender gap in technology and increase the potential for innovation and economic growth through gender equity.

Our programs help ignite a passion for technology in the next generation by reaching out to girls in middle school, high school, and college through Role Model Speaker programs and Scholarships. Equally importantly, our supportive network is there for our scholarship alumnae during their journey, as our members provide guidance, mentorship, and a path for their professional development. ITWomen is a multigenerational organization which began in the South Florida tri-county areas of Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach and in 2016, introduced a presence in the greater Orlando and Tampa metro areas.

Historical Impact

To date, ITWomen has provided over \$560,000 in scholarships to 98 girls pursuing careers in IT and engineering. Our Role Model outreach programs have touched over 22,000 girls and women in the South Florida area alone. Our continued efforts and success are a testament to the possibilities made real with joint public and private sector support.

Sisters Doing It For Themselves

In 2017, we are proud to have brought so many of our initiatives in-house, including providing robotics and coding camps through internal resources, volunteers and ITWomen scholarship alumna. For the first year, we took on the full management of the ITWomen scholarship application and award process, as well as management of the scholarship fund, maximizing monies available to award recipients. We feel confident that our insourcing of these events has allowed us to have closer contact with and more impact on our program recipients.

Moving Forward

The Current Landscape

Communities throughout South Florida need additional opportunities for youth to discover and explore careers that will improve socio-economic status in currently underserved families. With women taking the lead as heads of households, it is vital that they have the capabilities needed to vie for employment in all career fields, and in particular, those that have low participation by females.

Despite census reports that job openings in technology and engineering fields are on the rise, the gap between men and women employed in them is widening.

According to NCWIT data, women hold more than half of all professional occupations yet fewer than 26% of them are computing-related occupations. We are focused on the fact, however, that women in engineering and technology earn 33% more than comparable women in non-STEM jobs.

Furthermore, studies by the American Association of University Women (AAUW) determined that the primary cause preventing women and girls from entering STEM careers was stereotypes and the need for a "human focus" (i.e. role models and social programs) to support curriculum design.

Teachers and industry leaders in South Florida reiterate the "human focus" need as a

method to breaking the stereotype and recognize that early intervention is needed in order to recruit more girls into STEM programs.

The circumstances presented highlight the importance for ITWomen to continue assisting women in keeping pace with their male counterparts vying for jobs in the highest paying careers so their families can be supported and thrive.

Because of our work in South Florida over the past decade, ITWomen believes that is our responsibility to act as a catalyst between youth organizations and industry to provide pathways toward gender equity and professional opportunities for women in South Florida especially for girls at-risk.

Looking Ahead

This year, the introduction of a day-long professional development event hopes to expand the impact we have on local women already in the fields of IT and engineering, and perhaps sway those in other industries to consider a change! Through continued exposure to local members and future volunteers, ITWomen is poised to do more than ever in 2018.
